## Apple Built-in Ethernet 1.0f1 Patch

Apple has discovered problems with the software for built-in Ethernet on most high performance AV and PowerMacs. The patch called Built-in Enet 1.0f1 is a System Extension and requires the use of Network Product Software installer 1.45 to remove System resources so the patch may reside independently in the Extensions folder. On January 1, 1995, FreeHand will revert from Adobe(Aldus) to its original creators AltSys Corp.. However, Macromedia has announced its intentions to buy out AltSys.
