Jobs unveils iMac!

In the same room where he introduced the original Macintosh in 1984, Steve Jobs yesterday unveiled Apple's new consumer computer: the iMac. According to Jobs, the iMac makes using the internet as easy as using a Macintosh, and that's good. The iMac will arrive in August "fully loaded" for as little as \$1,299 US.

SAM Takes On New Worm

There is a new Macintosh worm called 'AutoStart 9805'. The AutoStart 9805 worm affects only PowerPC based systems. The worm spreads via QuickTime's AutoPlay feature and can corrupt files ending in .dat, .cod, .csa, and .data. The worm will attempt to spread to any mounted HFS or HFS+ volume. New virus definitions for SAM 4.5.x are available on-line to detect and remove this worm. Find them on-line at:
