



Humble Quark Apologizes for 4.0!

At September's Seybold Seminars San Francisco/Publishing 98, service bureau representatives voiced their reluctance to upgrade from QuarkXPress 3.3 according to eMedia Weekly article. The main grievance was the number of bugs in XPress 4.0, despite more than three years of development. Many said they refuse to accept customers' files in XPress 4.0 format. "We rightly deserved a lot of the malcontent," eMedia reported CEO Chuck Bland saying. "Quark is trying to change." Quark claims version 4.0.3 fixed most of the reported bugs, and Version 4.0.4, due by the end of October, will address many outstanding issues. IomegaWare Tools 1.0

Iomega has retooled its tools package and renamed it IomegaWare 1.0. The new software includes the Iomega Driver 6.02 which is said to correct all the bugs of the 6.01 release. Norton Utilities 4.0!

Symantec is now shipping Norton Utilities 4.0. The new version finally offers compatibility with Apple's new HFS+ (Mac OS Extended) disk format. (Unfortunately, the new version is Power PC only with a 68K edition still in the works). Some new features in NUM 4.0 include: Single pass fixing; Hierarchical file recovery; and, Disk Doctor is multi-threaded so it can now perform all its various inspections at the same time.

Asanté has quietly discontinued its network acceleration software NetDoubler. Apparently, improvements in AppleShare IP 6.0 and Mac OS 8.5 networking make its speed improvements available to everyone and on top of that the company has been unable to provide a reliable fix for QuarkXPress 4.0 incompatibility found in March when NetDoubler 1.5 shipped.
