USB Printer Sharing 1.0 lets you share Universal Serial Bus (USB) printers among multiple Macintosh computers using Transport Control Protocol / Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) on physical (Ethernet) and wireless networks (AirPort). According to Apple All USB PostScript printer compatible with Desktop Printer Utility 1.2 and LaserWriter 8.7 are compatible with USB Printer Sharing 1.0. This includes USB PostScript printers from Canon, GCC, Hewlett-Packard, Lexmark, Tektronics and Xerox. Version 6.2.1 supports FireWire storage devices plus USB, SCSI, ultra2, ultra160 and IDE storage devices. compatibility with Mac OS 8.5-9.0.x has been improved as has compatibility with Norton Disk Doctor for HFS+ partitions.

Symantec has released minor updates to Norton Utilities for the Mac (NUM) and Norton Antivirus for the Mac (NAV). The updates are part of a CD that can start up the latest G4s, iBook, and PowerBook G3s that come with Mac OS 9.0.x. If you don't need the CDs you can update for free using the Symantec Live Update feature. A few notes on this method: 1) Some cable modem services interfere with the operation of Live Update; 2) the NAV 6.0.2 updater tends to not work on versions that were previously updated to 6.0.1 using Live Update. In this case you will need to reinstall NAV 6.0 first. **Precursor Systems** would be pleased to help you with these updates at your next scheduled maintenance.
